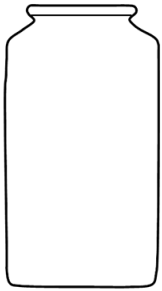

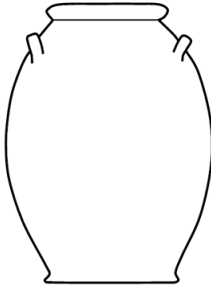

SMALL MOUTHED JARS

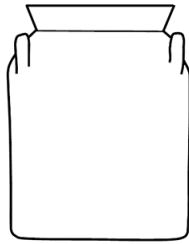
Large forms (over 2 gal.)

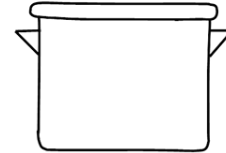

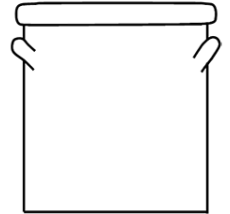

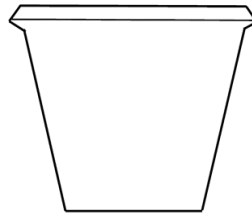

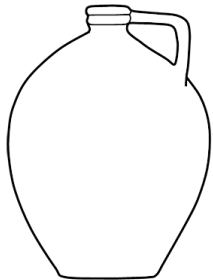

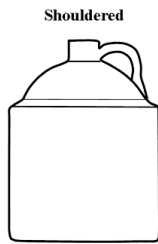

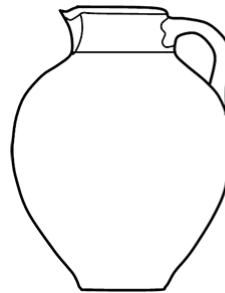

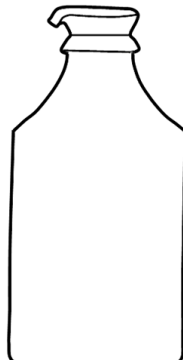
